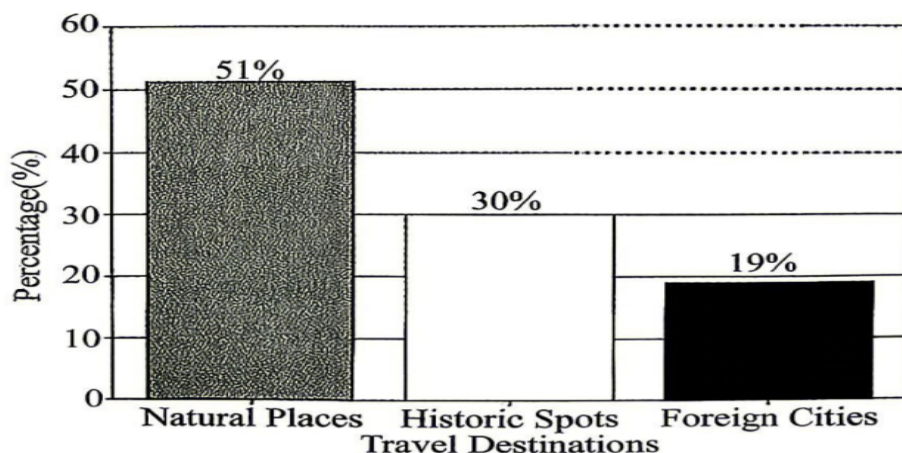

(周禹彤) Recently, our school English newspaper conducted a survey on travel preferences among Senior 3 students. The findings indicate that natural landscapes are the most popular choice, closely followed by historic sites, which account for 30% of the responses.

The underlying reasons are fairly clear. Burdened by intense academic pressure, the majority of students turn to natural scenery as a way to unwind (使身心轻松一下；解开) and refresh their minds, while immersing themselves in breathtaking scenery. Meanwhile, a considerable number of students are drawn to historic destinations, where they can explore the richness of the past culture and lose themselves in the stories of bygone eras.
